2019-nCoV Case Definitions

A. Suspect case A. Patients with acute respiratory illness (fever, cough, breathing difficulty), AND with no other etiology that fully explains the clinical presentation AND at least one of the following:

• a history of travel to or residence in China in the 14 days prior to symptom onset.

OR

• patient is a health care worker who has been working in an environment where severe acute respiratory infections of unknown etiology are being cared for.

OR

• worked or attended a health care facility where a confirmed case of 2019-nCoV is admitted in the last 14 days

OR

 close contact with a confirmed case of 2019-nCoV in the 14 days prior to illness onset, or

B. A suspect case for whom testing for 2019-nCoV is inconclusive

Confirmed case: A person with laboratory confirmation of 2019-nCoV infection, irrespective of clinical signs and symptoms.

In case such patients are encountered in the OPD they should be referred to RML or any other designated hospital. Patient should not go on his own but should be sent in an ambulance. He/she should wear a surgical / N95 mask.

RML sends ambulance to pick up patients if ambulance is not available in the referral hospital.


